Earth Day

Bridge Closure

In my February/March newsletter I informed you of the planned closure of the Pinnacle Road Bridge over the New York State Thruway. This bridge is to be closed on June 12, 2006, and be re-opened

on September 4, 2006. It is our understanding that Monroe County will be contacting the appropriate emergency services, school districts, and other municipalities that utilize Pinnacle Road during the proposed work period. A map of the detour layout is available at the Town Clerk's office.

Increasing of Veterans Exemption From Real Property Tax

At the Town Board meeting of February 8, 2006, the Town Board approved amending Town Code Chapter 103, Article IV Governing the Veterans Exemption from Real Property Tax. This will affect taxes collected in 2007. Details of the increased exemptions are available at the Assessor's Office.

Bridge Purchase

The Town Board has purchased a pedestrian bridge that had been used at the recent Gardenscape Show at the Dome Arena. This bridge is 12 foot wide and 30 feet long and made of pressure treated wood. Our plan is to convert this bridge into 2 pedestrian bridges that will be used to cross the ditch which goes through our property to the Honeoye Creek.



Emergency Generator

The 75KW Standby Generator has been installed, tested and is now operational. The Town Hall and Library will no longer be affected by power outages and will continue providing necessary services to all residents as well as providing a shelter

area during periods of extended power outages in the town.

Brush Pick-up

**The Town of Rush
Highway Department**

will be conducting its annual brush pick-up for our town residents commencing April 24, 2006, and running to April 28, 2006. We will begin on East River Road and will be working eastward.



The roadside brush collection will be a one-week program consisting of the following:

Guidelines:

- 2 Truckloads (10 wheeler) per Household
- Residential pick-up only
- All brush shall be no longer than 10 feet in length
- All brush shall be placed 6 - 8 feet from the edge of the roadside
- Brush shall be placed parallel to the road
- Brush must be neatly piled
- Do not place brush under any overhead wires, if possible
- Do not place brush over any water or gas service shut-offs

Restrictions:

- No Stumps, Lumber, Trash, Leaves, or Manmade articles
- Brush and limb wood only
- Brush cut by residents only, NO CONTRACTORS

**ONCE A ROAD OR STREET IS COMPLETED
THERE WILL BE NO RETURN TRIPS**

Stonybrook Road Transfer Station

Hours of operation at the **Stonybrook Road Transfer Station** will be on **Saturdays from 9:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. and Sundays 12:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. Opening April 15th and closing on November 5th.**

Town residences wishing to use a private contractor may pick up a "Hauling/Usage Statement" at the Town Hall. While obtaining resident's permission, this form will identify the person or company hauling the material to the site, on your behalf. This form will be required at the site and is only good for that day. **New this year - due to the raising cost of grinding, Contractors will only be**

allowed to haul two six-wheeler truck loads of brush per tax parcel.

If you have a special project planned and need to use the transfer station during the week, contact the Highway Dept. at 533-1770 at least one day in advance.

The district is purchasing forty new chairs and four tables for the meeting rooms.

FIRE DEPARTMENT & AMBULANCE:

FUND DRIVE: In 2005 your volunteers responded to an emergency call every 22 hours. They donated over 7,000 hours to provide service, attend meetings, attended training and drills, raise funds and maintain buildings and equipment with only ONE goal, which is to provide the best service we can for you and your family. We are 100% volunteer, NO ONE GETS PAID! We have one of the last free ambulance services in the county and cover 99.5% of our calls!

You should receive the annual fund drive letter for the AMBULANCE and FIRE DEPARTMENT operation in the first week in April. We would appreciate your quick

response to this annual appeal. If you give via United Way and chose the Rush FD please let us know. If you do not select us, we do not receive any of your United Way donations! 90% of the Ambulance operation and 100% of the cost of new ambulances (7 since 1939) came from fund drive money.

Other vehicles such the three Rescue trucks, two brush/utility trucks, ATV, Boat and trailer were purchased with fund drive money, memorial donations and carnival profit. Other items such as several AEDs, "Jaws of Life", water rescue, portable radios, pagers, thermal imaging camera, airbag system and other expensive items were bought with money from these funds.

We also use fund drive money for our complete scouting, fire prevention programs, training and seminars. No fund drive money is used for our few social events. Very few Fire Depts. or Ambulance services can say that! We are very proud and thankful to the Rush residents who support us with donations. **WE THANK YOU IN ADVANCE FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION!**

PAST OFFICERS BANQUET: The banquet was held at the RIT Inn & Conference Center - 98 members and guests attended. Holly Maynard of WHAM13 was the MC. Mike Terzo, Peter Henry and Jim McNeil were recognized for their past line officers duties. The "distinguished service award" was presented to Past Asst. Chief Peter Henry for his 20 years of service. Dick Wheeler and Bob Faugh were recognized for their 40 years of service. The RFD Ladies Auxiliary presented the department a check for \$3,000 for the firefighters on-going projects.

EXPLORERS SCOUTS: We are almost completely out of explorers - two recently joined the fire department and we are

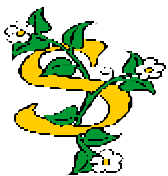

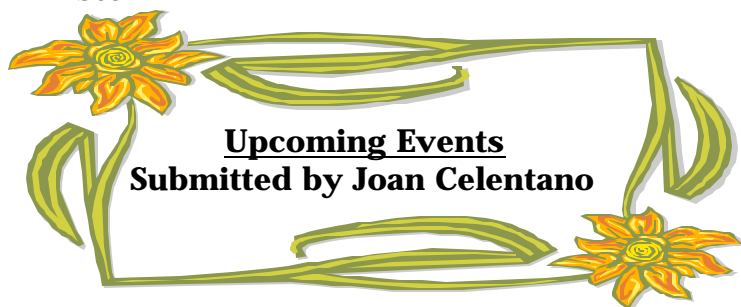
You may have noticed some new faces behind the circulation desk! We have welcomed **Linda Repka** and **Beth Hoagland** to our team of dedicated

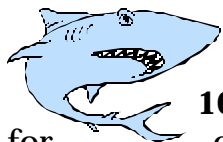

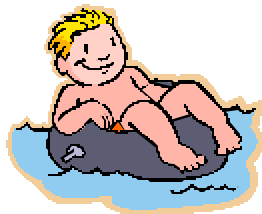

SUMMER CAMP - PROJECT CARE

We are happy to announce the new Summer Camp director for the project CARE camp for 7-10 year olds. The new director's name is Christie Lundgren. Christie is a Rush resident and teaches for the Rush- Henrietta School District. Christie is very excited about this year's summer camp. The 7-10 year old camp is funded through a grant by the Town of Rush Recreation Department, and Monroe County Youth Bureau. The camp is free to Rush residents. The camp is held at the Monica Leary Elementary School. Dates for this year's camp will be July 12th-August 11th, on Wednesdays from 8:30AM-2:30PM and Fridays 8:30AM-2:45PM with parents picking up the children at Sperry High School after swimming. The children will do all types of activities such as crafts,

swimming and fostering positive relationships. The asset building initiatives are also a part of the camp, i.e.; decision-making skills, conflict resolution and developing positive interpersonal skills. The camp continues to be a great success every year.

The camp is limited to 25 children, ages 7-10 years old. **The sign up for this program begins April 24th.**
