Dear Residents:

The 2007 Operating Budget was approved at the Town Board meeting of November 8th. The total tax rate per \$1,000 of Taxable Assessed Valuation (TAV) will remain at \$4.26 per \$1,000 of TAV. The total tax rate is made up of the Operating Budget which will be \$3.68 and the Revitalization and Building Debt Service of \$0.58. Comparing 2006, the Operating Budget is increasing from \$3.62 to \$3.68 per \$1,000 of TAV while the Revitalization and Building Debt Service is decreasing from \$0.64 to \$0.58 per \$1,000 of TAV. The total TAV is increasing from \$238,860,422 in 2006 to \$259,362,456 in 2007, an increase of 8.58%.

Some of our major costs for operation such as energy, health care and retirement continue to increase. We made a major change to our healthcare plan effective this year at a substantial savings. We continue to look for ways to reduce our consumption of energy without sacrificing services we provide. Town employees will receive a 3% wage adjustment in 2007. For details of our 2007 operating budget, please see Pages 10 and 11.

Over the past 6 years, the Operating Budget has gone from \$3.201 per \$1,000 of taxable assessed valuation in 2001 to \$3.680 in 2007. This is an increase of \$0.479 per \$1,000 of TAV which averages to \$.080 per year.

We welcome any input from residents that will improve our operating efficiency.

Camera Surveillance System

We will be installing a camera surveillance system at the Town Hall/Library in December 2006. Although we would prefer not to install this system, we do have a responsibility to protect all who work and use our facilities and also to protect our property. This system will cost approximately \$19,000. As you may know, our Town Hall and Library are protected by a security system and a fire alarm system. Cameras will be mounted to cover the exterior of the Town Hall/Library and parking lot as well as interior cameras in entry areas and high traffic areas.

On behalf of the Town Hall employees, we wish all of you a peaceful holiday season and a happy new year.

The annual Rush Fire District Commissioners election will be held on December 12th from 6 to 9 PM at the main Rush Fire Station. Robert Faugh is completing his term as commissioner and is on the ballot for 2006. This election is open to all registered voters in Rush.

The fire district organizational meeting will be held January 2, 2007, at the main fire station, 1971 Rush-Mendon Road, at 6:30 p.m.

The computer-based educational TV system in the fire station has been activated. It will be used by the City of Rochester and Monroe County Fire/EMS Bureau to provide up-to-date training and videos on fire, EMS and rescue instruction for our members.



It's time to put those plastic hydrant markers back. They could save your life and property!

In November our apparatus had their annual maintenance performed, oil, lubes and filters. The automatic transmissions use 96 quarts of ATF. One large air filter for the engine is \$100.00. The average cost for the annual maintenance per apparatus is \$1,200. We buy all the filters wholesale and have a 55 gal. drum of engine oil for the person doing the service. This saves you, the taxpayer, some money. Most of the minor maintenance is conducted by the officers and members of the fire department. The NYS Heavy Duty Truck inspections will be conducted in December.

RUSH FIRE DEPARTMENT AND AMBULANCE SERVICE: SENATOR ALESI MEMBER GRANTS: We have been notified by Senator James Alesi that we will receive a member item of \$12,000 for the replacement of turn-out gear in the 2006-2007 NYS budget. Our thanks to Senator Alesi for this effort.

As of November 21, 2006 your fire department and ambulance has responded to 335 calls for service.

LADIES AUXILIARY: ANNUAL ELECTION DAY DINNER was a success.

TAXES

Bills for Town and County taxes due during the month of January will be mailed on December 29th 2006. If you have in the past, but no longer have an escrow account and will be paying your own taxes and do not receive a bill, please contact the town clerk's office as soon as possible to obtain a duplicate bill.

First installment payments **MUST** be made on or before the 12th of February in order to retain the multi-payment option. The US Post Office cancellation date on the envelope must be used to determine if the payment is timely. For residents that use on-line bill paying options, please be aware that often there are no cancellation dates on the envelope. Give the bank five or more days to make your payment prior to the due date to avoid the payment being returned and an interest penalty being assessed.

Unlike school tax payments, all installment and full payments are made directly to Rush Tax Collector.

ORGANIZATIONAL MEETING FOR 2007

The final Town Board meeting for 2006 and the Organizational Meeting for the

Town of Rush for 2007 will be held on **WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 27TH AT 7:00 PM.** All residents are welcome at this and all board meetings through the year. An agenda of items to be discussed or public hearings to be held are always available three days before a scheduled meeting and can be obtained from the town clerk's office or viewed on the town's web site. Legal notices continue to be published in the Henrietta Post and the Sentinel.

ICE AND SNOW

Winter will soon be upon us with the dreaded ice and snow. Remember that the large parking lot behind the town hall offers the easiest access to the town offices and library. Once on the lower level you may take the steps or elevator to access the library or the main floors of the town hall. The court offices are located on the lower level.



LEGAL NOTICE OF RECEIPT OF TAX ROLL AND WARRANT

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that I, the undersigned Collector of Taxes in and for the Town of Rush, have received the Tax Roll and Warrant for the collection of taxes for the year 2007. I will receive these taxes at the Town Clerk's Office, 5977 East Henrietta Road, Rush, New York, Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Fridays from 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM and Thursday from 8:30 AM to 6:00 PM. Mailed payments should be addressed to Linda G. Henry, Collector, 5977 East Henrietta Road, Rush, New York, 14543.

Taxes will be received interest free through February 12, 2007. Payment made after February 12, 2007 will be subject to additional increment penalties of 1.5% per month. If you are making a full payment, interest is due on the total tax. If you are making a Partial payment, the interest

penalties are payable only on the portion due.

To be eligible for partial payment option, the first payment must be made by February 12, 2007. Taxes paid under the installment option are payable:

? 1st payment 50%, January 1 to February 12th-interest free

? 2nd payment 25%, February 13th to February 28th-1.5% interest penalty

? 3rd payment 25%, March 1st to April 2nd -3% interest penalty

ALL TAXES, are payable to the Town of Rush until May 31, 2007, when the Tax Rolls will be returned to the County of Monroe on June 1, 2007. Further information about payment, interest charge and payment locations are on the back of the tax bill.

Taxpayers who pay by mail should consider their cancelled check as their receipt. Receipts will be issued for payment only when specially requested and if the **ENTIRE TAX BILL IS SENT WITH PAYMENT.**

ANY TAXPAYER WHO HAS NOT RECEIVED A TAX BILL BY JANUARY 15TH 2007 is requested to contact the Rush Town Hall at 533-1312.

Highway Department

The winter season is now upon us and the crews have been engaged in winter preparations for the upcoming winter season. Below is a brief listing of winter preparation procedures we follow:

1. Converting our mode of operations from summer construction work to snow & ice operations
2. Maintenance of equipment
3. Equipment conversion (installation of plows, wings, sanders & calibration of computerized salting controls)
4. Placement of snow fences
5. Identifying and marking roadside obstacles

The Highway Department is always prepared for changes in the weather. We have systems in place that provide us with advanced warnings of upcoming weather conditions and we monitor weather changes 24 hours a day. Having the ability to react to upcoming weather conditions before they happen has made improvements in our Snow & Ice operating procedures.

This is also the time to remind residents of our seasonal parking ordinance:

Rush Town Ordinance §67-2 states:
No owner or operator of a motor vehicle shall park the same unattended on any Town or County street or highway within the Town of Rush between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m. from November 15 to April 15 of each year.
Vehicles parked within the Town's right-of-ways not only cause interference with snow removal procedures but also create a hazard to those traveling on the roads within the Town. Therefore, this ordinance was enacted to protect the health, safety, and welfare of those traveling throughout our Town.

The Highway Department asks that residents keep their mailboxes in good repair throughout the winter season. Mailboxes that are neglected will most surely be affected by our plows. All of our drivers take extra measures to avoid mailboxes, but sometimes weather

conditions (visibility) restrict the driver's ability to avoid problems.

Weekend brush drop off at the transfer station closed for the season on November 11th. Weekend hours will continue next spring. Information will appear in future newsletters. This year residents have dropped off a little over 1100 loads of brush. These loads will be chipped up for mulch next spring. *Residents still wishing to use the facility can contact the Highway Department at least one day prior.*

Driveway Snow Removal - As a reminder, depositing snow upon a highway is a **violation under Highway Law section 214**. The landowner and the contractor are both liable if the deposited snow causes an accident. So if you use a contractor for your driveway snow removal, please remind them!

Drama for Kids

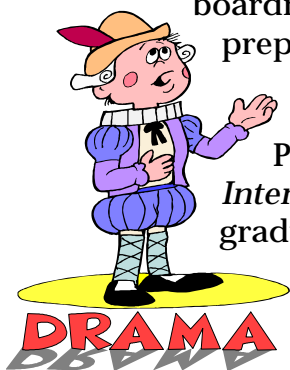
Whether destined for the stage or the boardroom, *Drama Kids* prepares children to speak clearly and with confidence. Instructor

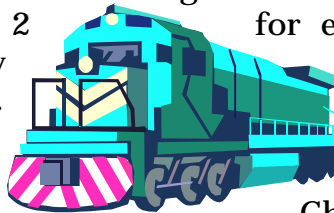
